War Diary 7th No. 2 Section February 1915**

LA GORGUE.

3rd. Quiet day.

4th. Quiet day.

LA GORGUE, near RICCHEBOURG.

5th.

3.30 p.m. Battn. leaves billets to take over duty in A Lines from 1/East Lancs. The day was fine and sunny.

9 p.m. Relief complete. Battn. H.Q. return to their old position.

6th.

Enemy shelled First Aid Post about 250x North of H.Q. twenty shells in all. One man R.F.A. who had been observing fire was killed. [This man was in Royal Field Artillery, so not Harris]

Capt. HODGSON, Lieut. STRANGER and 2/Lieut. WALKER returned from leave.

Fine during day but rained during night.

7th.

Quiet day in the lines, but about 2 p.m. heavy bombing and firing was heard from LA BASSEE direction.

Lieut. Jackson was slightly wounded in the head by a splinter from one of our own Howitzer's shells, whilst he was in No.2 Section. Our guns at the time were shelling some houses in the enemy's lines in front of No.2 Section.

Mild day.

Lieut. DOBBIE proceeded on seven days leave. A draft of forty five other ranks joined the Battn. and was kept in Transport lines.
