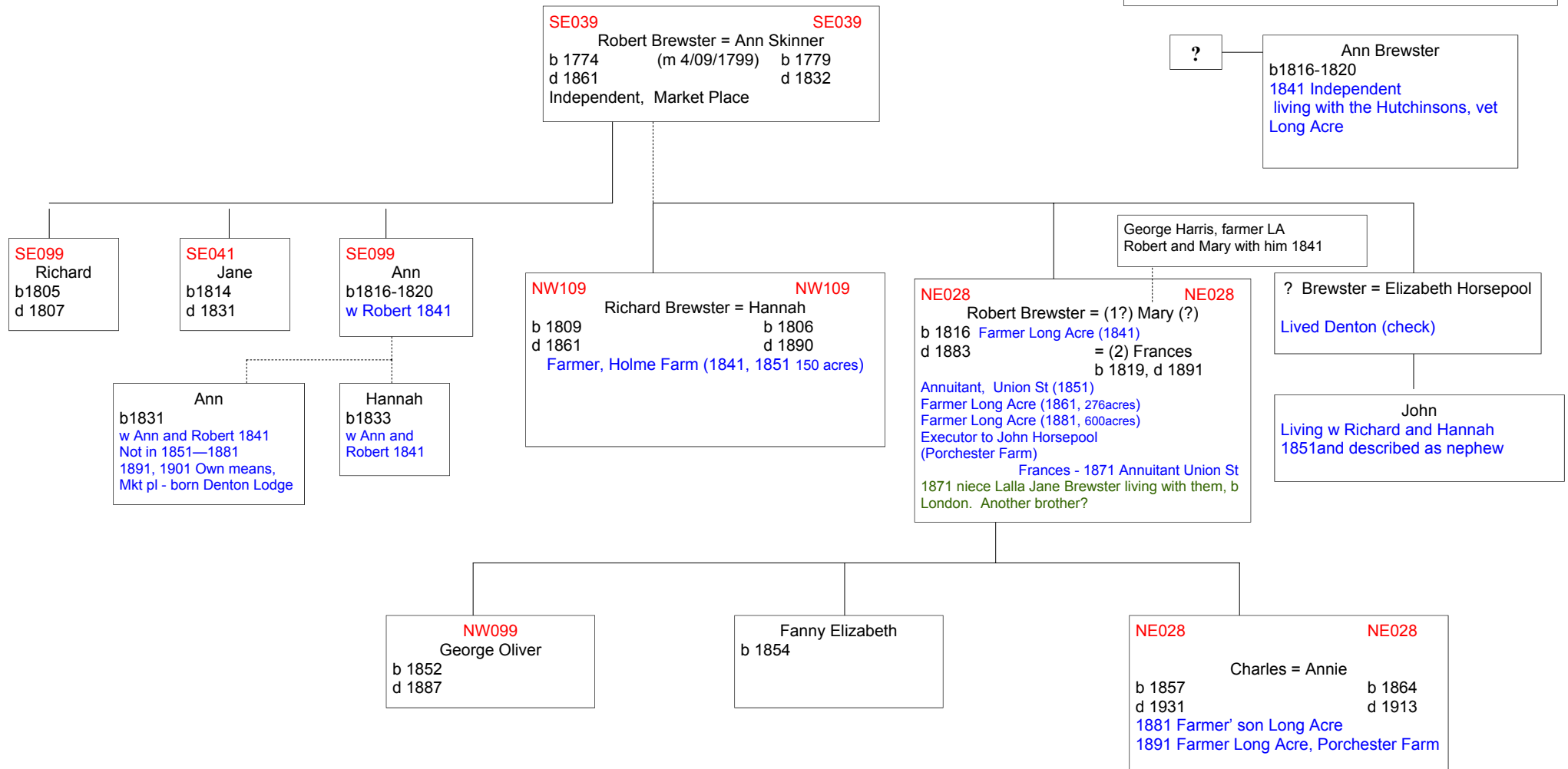


BREWSTER farmers

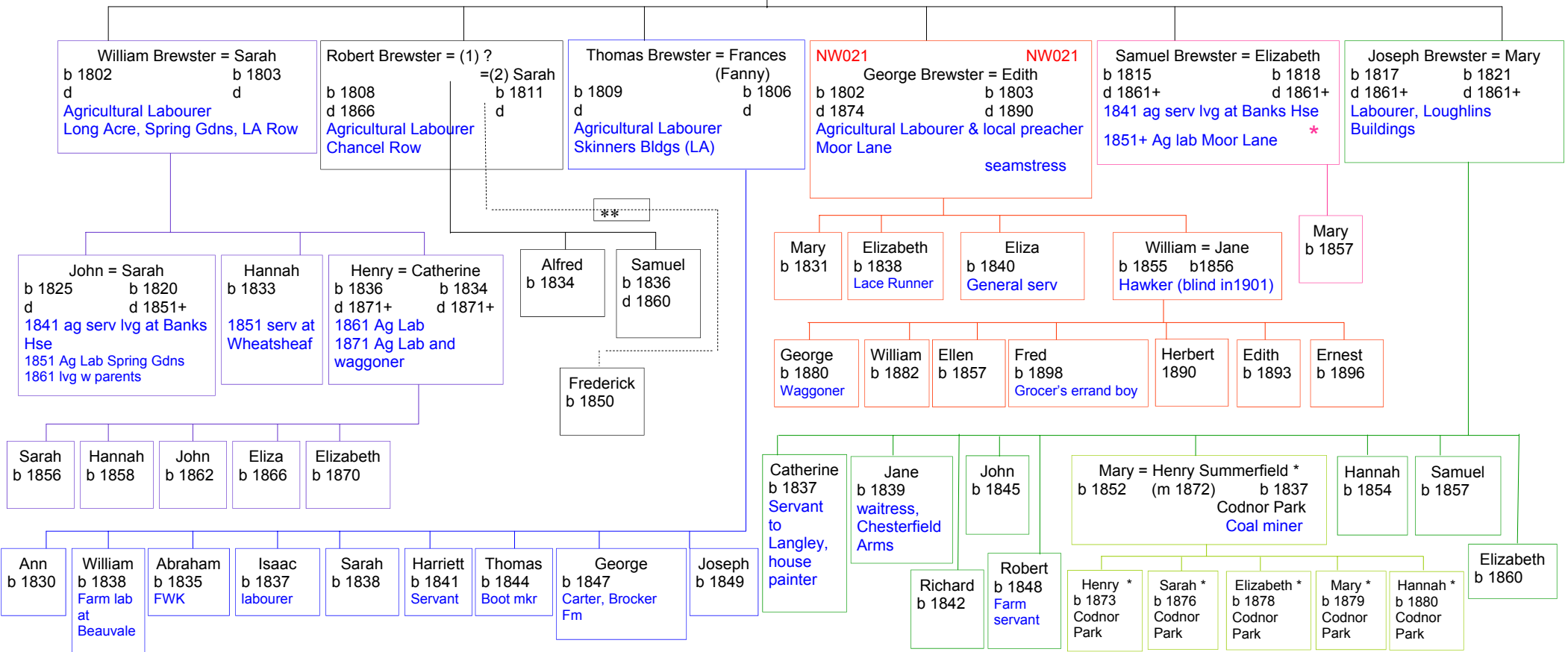


Note
 Being of independent means at age 65 - 69 suggests Robert (SE039) had had a rewarding occupation, maybe as a farmer. If so, he could have been father of one or both Robert (NW028) and Richard (NW114). However we have no direct evidence! This putative family tree shows the succession of ages is right for all to have been children of Robert and Ann. We know from deeds of 19 Church Street that Elizabeth Brewster was John Horsepool's sister and he named Robert the younger as an executor. Elizabeth had a son of the right age and birthplace (Denton) to be the nephew noted as living with Richard and Hannah in 1851 and thus confirming the relationship between these three.
