Field Archaeological Activities – Bingham

BHTA is organising a project, funded by the Local Heritage Initiative, requiring volunteer members of the BHTA to carry out fieldwork. There are two parts to the project. One is an archaeological field walking survey of the arable land in the parish. The other is a topographical survey of the earthworks in Crow Close. In both cases the work will require the volunteers to move about on farmland, on which there may be ditches, farm machinery, farm implements, livestock, etc. It is possible that the ground will be muddy or, at times, frosty.

Volunteers should take care to dress appropriately for the weather and time of the year. Sturdy footwear will be required at all times and warm, weatherproof clothing during the winter.

Volunteers should inform the BHTA of any illness or disability, which may constitute a risk while doing fieldwork in advance of taking part in fieldwork.

For the duration of this project BHTA will be covered by public liability insurance, which covers damage etc to crops, farmland, buildings and farm equipment and any risk to third parties. It does not cover volunteers for injury to themselves or loss or damage to their own property.

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It is for individual volunteers to decide if they require to take out their own personal accident insurance. BHTA cannot accept any liability or responsibility arising from any accident, injury, loss or damage however sustained. Should any member wish to arrange personal injury insurance for field walking it can be done through the Council for British Archaeology.
