Commemorated Alamein Memorial, Matruh, Egypt: Column 63 (at entrance to war cemetery of 12,000 who died in Western Desert campaigns)</p> <p>CWGC: Son of Ernest and Helen fellows and husband of Louise Fellows, of Thorpe Bay Essex</p> <p>Also commemorated on Nottingham Boys High School war memorial. <i>From The Nottinghamian December 1942:</i> <i>"After leaving school he played for several seasons for the Old Nottinghamians R.F.C, where he developed into a powerful and dangerous forward. His fellows will long remember him for the prominent part he took in the social activities of the club, and for his clever mimicry of Stanley Holloway recitations at Annual Dinners. He took a keen interest in Nottingham amateur boxing and wrestling, and, while at an O.C.T.U. in 1941, he won a silver cup presented for boxing."</i></p> <p>NOTE: date of death (Roll of Honour) 10<sup>th</sup> October, but CWGC and Notts High School have 25<sup>th</sup> October.</p>		
14 <sup>th</sup> Battalion, Sherwood Foresters	<p>Between 10<sup>th</sup> June 1940 and 13<sup>th</sup> May 1943 battles took place in North Africa along 1000 km of desert between Alexandria and Benghazi. 23<sup>rd</sup> October- 5<sup>th</sup> November 1942 was the Second Battle of El Alamein. The fighting was for control of the Mediterranean, links with the East through the Suez Canal, Middle East oil and a supply route to Russia through Persia.</p>
