<p>No. 41 RM Commando, Royal Marines</p>	<p>Liberation of Belgium from 2nd September 1944 with 2nd British Army at Douai. Entered Brussels on 3rd September 1944. They were aided by the Belgian Resistance and Free Belgian Forces. Liberation was completed on 4th February 1945.</p>
