<p>Post War</p>	<p>Post war Eric became a town councillor and served several times as Mayor of Bingham. He was mayor of Rushcliffe in 1985. The block of apartments in Moor Lane is named Green Court in his honour.</p>		
<p>Post War</p>	<p>In 1959 he and his wife bought 9 Newgate Street. Mrs Green converted the large extension attached to the house into a penny library which remained until Notts County Council opened the library in Eaton Place.
