War Service	<p>Gilbert joined the Merchant Navy in 1931 at the age of 16 as an apprentice. Between 1931 and July 1943 he served on three different ships of which 9 journeys are recorded on Ancestry. He was an able seaman. On 19 July 1943 it is thought that he was aboard the Kaituna, a New Zealand owned ship with a British crew in the Mediterranean off Cyprus when it was damaged by a limpet mine and consequently beached.</p> <p>His medal list at National Archives shows he qualified for the 1939-45 Star, Atlantic Star, Africa Star, Pacific Star, Italy Star, War medal. The list is endorsed to show that in 7/46 “the awards were referred on to the New Zealand authorities”.</p>
