	He began his naval career on HMS Ganges, a training ship for boys. He passed his swimming test 13.10.14 and was trained on "mining" the following month. Having served on a variety of ships (see navy record for details) he was transferred to the reserve in 1929. He was paid his war gratuity in 1914 whilst serving on HMS Inflexible. He spent seven days in the cells in March 1923 for an unspecified offence. Despite this his conduct was most usually described as "VG".				
	His longer attachments included periods at Gallipoli, The Mediterranean, North UK waters including the battle of Jutland and the surrender of the German High Seas Fleet at Scapa Flow, the Turkish crises of 1922/3 and he may even have witnessed the argument between two commanders over which dance band to engage for a ship's dance in Malta in 1928!				
	At the end of his 12 year engagement Frank remained in the Royal Navy. He retired in 1934 with a naval pension but was recalled to serve in shore bases (Pembroke and Europa) around Chatham from October 1939 to January 1945.
