Death and probate	<p>20/11/1947 Nottingham Journal: Death of Ex-Chief Inspector Winch Mr. Harold Gordon Winch, of the Wheatsheaf Inn, Bingham, has died at the age of 53. He retired from the Nottingham City Police with the rank of chief inspector on 31 December, 1945. A native of Truro. Cornwall, he was educated at Norwich and joined the City Police in February. 1914. He was in the Army in France from July, 1915, to January. 1919, and then returned to the City Police. He served in various departments and was promoted chief inspector in 1941. He was awarded the George VI Coronation Medal. Mr. Winch was at one time hon. general secretary of the City Police Athletic Club. He had also instructed the Special Constabulary, the ATS.
