## **Biblical quotations**

Excluding those already discussed, 44% of all epitaphs carry a short, usually one line, quotation from the bible or, less often, a hymn. In most cases the derivation of the quotation is not given on the stone, whether this was because the reader was expected to know it, we do not know! Of these stones 77% are from the post 1850 period and 20% from 1800-1849. 97% are from the nineteenth century. A similar trend was noted earlier in respect of Children's deaths at 91%.

Competing with Romanticism in the nineteenth century, Evangelicalism tended to preach hell fire and damnation and to concentrate the mind on biblical correctness. Many socially important movements are based in the evangelical movement; the abolition of slavery and the development of orphanages are examples. The movement became particularly strong after the decline of the Romantic period from the 1850s. Much stress was placed on the centrality of the bible, on salvation through belief rather than good works and the need personally to commit to Jesus Christ. The High Church practices of Tractarians Rev. Miles (1845-1883) and Rev. Droosten (1884-1910) may have contributed to the trend in Bingham. The quotations are pithy, quite often leave much of the text unsaid and one wonders whether there are hidden messages or meanings relevant to the deceased contained within them. Some quotations are worthy of the description 'obscure', and perhaps imply a deep knowledge of the bible on the part of the deceased or the family. As one reads through the list a number of favourites become evident – e.g *Blessed are the dead that die in the Lord.*
